

COLORS OF FALL



Ginkgo

Ginkgo leaves, which turn golden yellow in the fall, are known around the world for their medicinal value.



Red Maple

This tree gets its name not just from its red fall foliage, but also because of its red flowers and fruit.



Black Oak

Black oak leaves turn deep red or brown in the fall and many stay attached to the tree throughout the winter.



Sugar Maple

The color of these leaves is highly variable, including brilliant oranges and yellows.



White Oak

These leaves turn reddish brown, and like the leaves of other oaks, often do not fall at all.



Tulip

This tree gets its name from its tulip-shaped flowers and leaves.



London Plane

This leaf, symbol of City of New York\ Parks & Recreation, turns yellow briefly and then golden brown.



Sweetgum

Sweetgum leaves turn yellow first and then become red before falling to the ground.



Linden

The fall color of these leaves varies from yellow to orange to brown.



Flowering Dogwood

This is a small tree with deep crimson fall foliage.



Shagbark Hickory

The large compound leaves of this tree turn golden brown in the fall.



Sassafras

The aromatic sassafras leaves can turn yellow, orange or red in the fall, depending on environmental conditions.
