Henry Hudson's Historic Voyage Celebrated at the
18th Annual Lefferts Historic House Quilt Exhibit
at Prospect Park

On view November - December. Free Admission.

Brooklyn, NY -- 2009 marks the 400th anniversary of Henry Hudson's arrival in our harbor, which led to the establishment of what would become New York City. Lefferts Historic House in Prospect Park is dedicating its [18th Annual Quilt Exhibit](#) to the quadric-centennial of Hudson's voyage.
