



Update on Playgrounds in Prospect Park

Prospect Park has seven dynamic and award-winning playgrounds that serve thousands of children and their families in neighborhoods all around the Park: **Harmony Playground, Imagination Playground, Lincoln Road Playground, Third Street Playground, Parade Ground Playground, Vanderbilt Street Playground, and Garfield Tot Lot.**

The Prospect Park Alliance is committed to maintaining and upgrading these playgrounds so that they can continue to be engaging and safe play areas for present and future generations of children.

Playground renovations:

Beginning Tuesday, July 28 the Vanderbilt Playground will undergo a major renovation project. We anticipate that construction will last approximately 1 year, during which time the Playground will be closed.

During the closure, we encourage our users to use any of the Park's 6 other playgrounds, including the Imagination Playground (located at Ocean Avenue between Lincoln Road and Parkside Avenue), The Detective Dillon Stewart Playground (located at the Prospect Park Parade Ground) or the Harmony Playground (located at 11th Street and Prospect Park West), which are the closest to Vanderbilt Playground.

This major renovation project was made possible thanks to funds secured by City Council Member Bill de Blasio in the FY 07 and 08 City Budgets. The design for the renovated Vanderbilt Playground was produced by the Prospect Park Alliance office of Design and Construction.
