



Summer Permit Information

Outdoor Season:

A permit is needed to use an outdoor tennis court during daytime hours at the Prospect Park Tennis Center from May 14 through October 2, 2022.

Purchase or Renew A Tennis Permit.

- Tennis permit applications (both new permits and renewals) must be completed online at <https://www.nycgovparks.org/permits/tennis-permits/apply>
- Log In to manage your Tennis permits for the current year.
- Create an Account to purchase a tennis permit, single play tickets, and lookers.

Permits fees:

Juniors (under 18): \$10
Seniors (62 and over): \$20
Adults: \$100

Once purchased, tennis permits cannot be refunded or transferred. Adults with a valid IDNYC card can receive 10% off their full-season permit fee.

To Create an Online Tennis Account

To manage your tennis information online, you need to create an account with New York City. If you already have an account with a New York City agency, you can log in and you will be directed to purchase a tennis permit.

To obtain a permit you will need:

- A photo, taken with a clear background (similar to a passport photo)
- A form of photo identification
- An IDNYC card, if you are applying for an IDNYC discount.
- Check or money order for appropriate dollar amount.
- Visa, MasterCard and American Express are accepted.
- Proof of age (for senior and junior permits)

Receipt of Tennis Purchase

Allow up to three weeks to receive your tennis permit by mail. If you recently renewed or purchased your tennis permit online, you can pick up your permit in person at the Arsenal, at 830 Fifth Avenue in Central Park, Mon-Fri, 9 am-4pm.

Reservations for daytime play:

- May be made only by holders of a Parks tennis permit.
- May be made up to one week in advance.
- Must be made in person the first time and by telephone thereafter only if permit number and credit card information is on file.

May 14 – October 2, 2022

Open daily, 7 am-11 pm
Permits honored during daylight hours only.
