


Lefferts Historic House



Today I am going to Lefferts Historic House. My family may have to park on the street nearby. It is important that I stay with my family when I walk over to the historical area. Staying with my family keeps me from getting lost and safe from other cars.



When I get to the Lefferts House, a member of the staff will greet my family and me. I can say hello back or ask where I go next on my tour.





There will be lots of activities. The activities will change based on the season. Each time I return to Lefferts Historic House, I may do different activities.



In some areas of Lefferts, I can touch everything and explore whatever I want. To see other areas, I may have to wait for a guide. If an area is closed by a gate or roped off, I should not explore it on my own or touch anything in it. This is for my safety and to help preserve the historical items.





If I'm not able to go on the tour upstairs but want to see what it is about, there is a picture book in the front hallway. My guide can show me.



At Lefferts House, I may have the chance to play with toys, do an art project, or cook something. Games might be walking on stilts or spinning a hoop. If I am not sure how to play with the toys, I can ask a guide.



Inside the house, I can do crafts or play with blocks or other fun toys. I can also read books. I might have to share the books and toys with other visitors. This is so everyone can have fun.







Eating is allowed outside. My family may even help make food with the guides. There will be other places where we will not be allowed to eat. It is important to follow the rules about food so that we do not make a mess.



Carousel

Near Lefferts House, there is a carousel. The carousel might have loud music or a crowd around it. If my family wants to ride on the carousel, we will need to get tickets and wait on a line. This is because a lot of people like to ride the carousel. If it is too loud for me, I can ask my family for earplugs or headphones or ask to wait outside the carousel. It is important that I tell someone from my family before walking away.





There are many things to learn at the Historic House Trust museums. My family will be very proud of me for following directions and staying with them during our time at Lefferts House.
